SCHOOL INFORMATION

The American School of Durango was the first bilingual school in the state of Durango, established in 1954. The education program of the American School of Durango is designed to provide opportunities to develop personal values, interests, skills, knowledge, and civic attitudes for active and responsible participation in a democratic society. The self-disciplined student will find many rich academic and extracurricular activities for individual and social growth. Students attend school 200 days, five days a week and a minimum of 6 hours a day. It is important to note that most of our students are heavily involved in extracurricular activities that include the sports program, Model United Nations, Yearbook, Homework / Mentor Program to name just a few of some enrichment opportunities for students in grades one to twelve. These after school activities are a result of the dedication of ASD's faculty members. Since its beginning, the school has been accredited by the Secretary of Public Education of the State of Durango. In 1998, our schools became fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and the National Autonomous University of México (UNAM). This dual accreditation greatly benefits ASD graduates in their choices of the highest quality international universities. High school revalidation from UNAM is done by grade every school year and a report is submitted to SACS on the school's academic progress and operational performance.

STAFF

For the **2011-2012** school year, the **teaching staff** consists of a 64 members, 42 of which have a Bachelor's degree, 10 of which have a Master's degree. There are 14 native English speakers on staff, with origins in the United States, Canada, and Scotland. The French teacher is a native speaker from France. The administration includes a director and three principals.

STUDENTS

Greater than 95% of all students are host-country nationals; the remaining students are international, including students from the United States, Korea, Venezuela, England, and Australia. The school population is predominantly Spanish speaking.
